



- 1. Question: What is the season of the year between summer and winter? Answer: Autumn
- 2. Question: What is another name for the autumn season? Answer: Fall
- 3. Question: How did "fall" get its name? Answer: Because leaves fall from the trees during autumn
- 4. Question: In what months does fall start and end north of the Equator? Answer: September and December
- 5. Question: What is the autumnal equinox (or autumn equinox)? Answer: The first day of fall when the day and night are equal in length.
- 6. Question: When is the approximate date of the autumnal equinox (the start of fall)? Answer: September 22 or 23
- 7. Question: What is the name for an unseasonably warm period of weather that happens in the fall? Answer: Indian summer
- 8. Question: What is the name of the full moon that occurs closest to the start of autumn? Answer: Harvest moon
- 9. True or false: The Sun crosses the celestial equator at the autumnal equinox. Answer: True

- 4. Question: What is the name of the pigment that causes leaves to turn brown? Answer: Tannins
- 5. Question: What is the name of the pigment that gives leaves their yellow and orange colors? Answer:

 Carotenoids
- 6. Question: What are the pigments that cause leaves to turn red or purple? Answer: Anthocyanins
- 7. Question: What type of trees lose leaves in the fall?
 Answer: Deciduous trees

- 4. Question: What insect travels from the U.S. to Mexico in the fall? Answer: Monarch butterflies
- 5. Question: What bird did Benjamin Franklin want to be the national bird? Answer: Turkey
